Abram (Abe) Warkentin passed away on June 10, 2021 at Watrous District Health Complex at the age of 90 years. Abe was born at his parent's home near Nokomis. He attended Flanderdale School until 1945 when his family moved to the farm near Watrous where he still resided. He continued his schooling in Watrous and graduated in 1949. In June 1966, he married Lillian Harding from Venn, SK. They would have celebrated their 55th wedding anniversary on June 30.

Abe was a farmer, but also did many other jobs during the winter. He worked in Safeway in Winnipeg in the produce department, loaded railway cars, drove school bus and did custom land clearing with his D7 Cat bulldozer. Later he did custom combining.

He served on the RM of Morris council for 7 years as councillor and 6 years as the Reeve. He served on many boards during this time such as Manitou Lodge Board, Watrous Union Hospital Board, and the Living Sky Health Board. He also served on the Rural Economic Development Association.
